

IMPORTANT NOTICE

- Failure to declare goods can result in penalties and may include forfeiture of the goods.
- If you are taking a package for anyone, make sure you know what is in the package.
- Duty Free Allowances does not apply to goods for commercial purposes (articles for sale, for soliciting orders etc).
- Attempts to import prohibited items can result in prosecution, the imposition of fine and /or imprisonment and seizure of goods.
- This list is not exhaustive .If in doubt ask a Customs Officer.
- There are heavy penalties for untrue declarations.

Understanding the Customs Declaration Form

The Customs Declaration Form (C105) is a document that allows Customs to enforce the laws of the Turks & Caicos Islands as they pertain to admissibility and importation.

Read the Declaration thoroughly and complete it.

Residents - Declare all items acquired abroad and the price paid for them. Keep your receipts for all items purchased abroad.
Declare gifts received.

Visitors – Declare gifts brought for others and other items acquired along with their purchase price.

Sign the Customs Declaration Form

Only written declaration per family is required.

Duty Free Allowances

All passengers 17 years and older are allowed the following, in quantity indicated, without the payment of duty:

Alcoholic Liquor

1 liter of rum or spirits
2 liters of wine



Tobacco Goods

200 cigarettes OR
100 cigarillos OR
50 Cigars OR
125 grammes of smoking tobacco



Perfumes

Up to 50 grammes perfume OR
0.25 liters of toilet water (Eau de Toilette)



Any other dutiable goods purchased or obtained outside the Islands to a total value not exceeding \$400 USD.

PROHIBITED OR RESTRICTED GOODS

Controlled drugs and utensils used therewith.

Firearms, ammunition and explosives (including fireworks) unless accompanied by a valid license signed by the Commissioner of Police.

Obscene items or pornographic literature, films or videotapes.

CASH OR NEGOTIABLE INSTRUMENTS

The transportation of cash or negotiable items regardless of the amount is legal. However the transportation of cash or negotiable instruments regardless if you take out or bring into the Turks &

Caicos Islands more than \$10,000.00 (US or foreign equivalent or a combination of the two) in coin, currency or negotiable instruments such as a draft or bill of exchange, debenture bonds a company, script certificates to the bearer for shares or share warrants to the bearer, you are required by law to declare these to Customs. Failure to declare the total amount you are carrying may lead to seizure of all the cash or negotiable instruments and may subject you to legal proceedings and /or criminal prosecution.
